Proceedings:

Meeting called to order by Michael Alvaro.

Opening reflection:

Adoption of agenda by Amanda Fiume seconded by Mark Hyer.

Motion to amend agenda. Francesca Imbrogno motioned for ratification of Jessica Walsh into SMCSU as UTSU representative and to include this article addition as ratification of UTSU bi-election. Seconded by Adriano Marchese. No discussion, motion received unanimous motion.

Adoption of Agenda:

Motion to adopt agenda. Speaking rights extended to UTSU VP university affairs Adam Awad. He informed SMCSU of initiatives around the campus. On December 6, Montreal massacre event. Graduate student union started campaign for accessibility of paved side walk by Queen's park. The campaign's goal was to build crosswalk or side lights for increased safety of pedestrians, signatures are needed. Another initiative is the good food box drop off location. Local food, fruits and vegetables from farmers distributed on campus. This is available at Innis residence. UTSU aim to have food drop off locations in other locations. Last initiative is to eliminate use of water bottles. Adam Awad educated the SMCSU on bottled water; bottled water

are wasteful and generally not better than tap water. Adam Awad left the meeting. He can be reached at adam@utsu.ca

Adoption of Minutes:

None.

Ratification of UTSU bi-election results:

Motion to adopt by Matt Pinto, seconded by Adriano Marchese. Discussion by James Finlay. James Finlay asked Jessica Walsh about the equity training – anti-oppression training UTSU recommended to her. Jessica Walsh stated that due to the racist overtone in her campaign Youtube video, it is recommended by UTSU president Sandy Hudson that any members involved goes to anti-oppression training. Jessica Walsh stated that it wasn't directly stated what was seen in Youtube video. A section of the minutes from UTSU meeting was read to the rest of the council, suggesting that remarks and profanity were evident in the Youtube video, James Finlay added, despite the fact that it was purely satirical. As of now, Jessica Walsh said UTSU plan on having it early in the New Year early January. Sami Enami added that the election referendum committee recommended all new members and all members who did not attend to attend meeting, as the video was taken as offensive in sexist and racist nature. Although UTSU did over rule the CRO's decision to give jess points for video, she would have to make sure she does not represent racism. Jessica Walsh ratified into SMCSU council.

Reports:

President:

Francesca Imbrogno announced that the hair cut event was a success, and that Father Jim shaved. She also reminded the council that they must show up for their assigned office hours. Even with people covering hours, people might still come during designated office hours to look for someone during their regular office hours.

Vice-president:

Justin Rodrigues said people should know when their office hours are, since there are only two hours per week. If no one covers, then office would have to close early. This is not good. He added, the Coffee shop by the corner of Brennan will be Seattle's best, it is below Starbucks, not Starbucks. In regards to postering duties, council members need to find time to walk and go around residence. If anyone haven't postered, there will be consequences. People work hard for events, if posters are not put up, then there is no point in having councillors or officers.

Finance:

Adriano Marchese has been busy with midterms. Checks will be ready by tomorrow noon.

RCA:

Amanda Fiume is working on SMCSU apparel and sweater with Amir Torabi and James Finaly. There will be a meeting tomorrow at 12pm in Brennan lounge. If anyone has designs or ideas for t-shirts, they are welcomed to bring to the meeting tomorrow. The committee is looking to make one sweater and two t-shirts. The shirts will be done at an American apparel store at Kensington market. Amanda Fiume asked the council about the signatures required for Crosswalk whether UTSU or SMCSU collects the signatures. Amanda Fiume is still working on topic for Dinner with Father Jim. She wants to host the event in Charbonnel lounge, to get gala type feeling thing going on. She also said the event turnout was not as great as expected, and there were no posters up for events. She suggested bringing dons to bring out people, so they could advertise for RCA. Francesca Imbrogno thinks that more signatures could be gathered. Council members could all take one page and take ten signatures and drop in RCA tray. Amanda Fiume will drop them off to UTSU.

Double Blue:

Haleigh King on Formal: she thanked members that came out to formal meeting, planning one of the important events for Double Blue. She reminded members to be professional when attending formal meeting. Formal may be moved from March 12 (Friday) to the 19th. This week academic schedule shortened by one week. Formal will be held at Liberty Grand, it is a great location. Current budget will not allow buses. Hopefully money from engineer party will permit parties. She mentioned TTC buses are a possibility. The theme will be Renaissance. No one got back to her for the name. She showed around pictures of room. Candles will be free because we will have 600 people. The pre-formal: sign up mezzanine. It will be up top. People would move downstairs for actual formal. Don't have to move tables downstairs. The total amounts to \$34850. Haleigh King said that Caleigh helped. Formal committee message will be sent out.

Deryn Robson and Haleigh King would appreciate more SMCSU attendance.

Deryn Robson on Winterfest. It will no longer be an UTSU Winterfest. Now is SGRT Winterfest. Every Wednesday at 8-10 in Woodsworth 101. Party. Club. Same building with addition of Suite. Maximum three people from each college, but mainly SMC run. It will be at Brunny. There will be a pub crawl. The pass will give access to all pubs.

Kavinda Senanyake wanted the formal meetings to take place outside the office. He suggested moving the time or location so people in the office are not disturbed. Stefan Slovak said office was provided for meetings such as the formal. He also said that TTC chartered buses may be an option for the formal. The committee would only be paying for a block in beginning, and block at end. He suggested loading at least 65 people per bus, to book three or four buses and load them on. This has been done during this year's frosh. Haleigh King said it would cost \$20 for 4 people for cab right to Liberty Grand.

Kyle Farren wanted a more detailed update on progress of double blue formal meeting. Haleigh King said she has been sending detailed Facebook messages after every meeting.

Deryn Robson said during Halloween he felt like people were riding on SMC's coat tails. Personally he would love to throw SMC's own party. But he thinks that this is something special. Thinks quote that Stefan Slovak gave would be very useful. Presale will be \$3, Tuesday night is pub crawl. Club night Thursday. \$5 at the door. SMC has Brunny's.

Haleigh King said because of the given budget, the committee is picking from the prom menu. It will be a three course meal. There will be drink tickets, but it will be nothing huge like last year. She is working on this right now. She wanted to redo the slide show. During break, want to center on commission, students and events and not just events.

Deryn Robson said resale for Winterfest will be \$5 online. Write pick up locations. This is done as an attempt to increase attendance of commuters. It will be run like any other club night. Will have the floor, Suite may be taken out. There will be 4 DJs for each room. Amir Torabi hooked up with local rapper and two drummers. Deryn Robson will try to get one MC for each room. There is lot more money to spend for this party. Suite, Halloween even though had 1500, at one point. But Lot was empty. Most people flocked to Wet Bar. Francesca Imbrogno said that for formal, there will be security there who will do wristband.

Smcformal09. Stefan Slovak will give Haleigh King the slideshow password for pictures for formal.

Communications/ Promotions:

Cynthia Mutheardy wanted volunteer photographers, so there is more content to put on the website. The Gram deadline has been extended to January 8th. She motion to strike up media committee. Kristian Mandarano wanted more people to put up pictures online and more ideas. 1400 people went on website, whether it's individuals or repeats. Poll questions was easy to put up. Lenny would not mind. Vote in favor. Media committee passes. Digital copies for Gram.

DSAC:

Matt Pinto said traffic was okay. Santa was here. Pictures were taken, they will be put up on group. Mini breakfast will be available next week in Kelly. It won't be really big, just word of mouth, and online. New Year meeting beginning of month to see what kind of event people would want to see, what they want. Olympic geared events. Figure skating, speed skating, hockey. Deryn Robson suggested postponing the event till next week. Stress busters last week, with coffee, tea last week. He suggested to have something small next week.

Laura said to keep the office clean.

Education and Government:

Khalid Mahdi on events to come: Reinforcing policies in place is emphasized by administration. In process of planning symposium and have several potential guest speakers, thinking of fee and will finish and finalize from there. There was supposed be a liturgical choir representative to petition for funding. Second round of club recognition second week of classes. He needs posters. Faculty invitations need to be done at least month and a half before event takes place. Invites will go out to faculty, administration, students, alumni. 104 tickets. \$10, even to as low as \$5, will cover labour. He wanted to keep costs low and wants to get more people in room. Event will be on March 24th.

Arts and theatre:

Laura Fallico said the musical was a huge success. West side story turned out really well. Musical received great reviews from people who came to watch. Huge spread with alumni

spread. It was a huge thing for alumni to see. 180 seats last year, this year was 289 seats. Tickets were sold out on Friday and Saturday. Tickets sale the week before wasn't so well, posters weren't done well, and some were postered over. She thanked people for helping with programmes, and suggested increasing the budgets so the job can be sent out. Rely on Xerox machine was not good. Set and costumes, almost done unloading things. Audiences saw the difference a set and a stage makes. She thanked people who participated in the show. Theatre is very important in the community. The event was such a huge outreach to community as large, not just SMC, people came from out of town, from other colleges, not just students. She thinks that in future years, the budget should be reviewed. Huge expense to put on show there's overtime, makeup, costume, set up, make up. Council need to look in to how much money is given to theatre. Almost \$12000 in sales. She thanked ushers. Certain guidelines, behaviours expected from the ushers - Theatre etiquette. Pictures were taken by Daniel Demarco. He took lot of pictures, and will contact Lenny Popliansky to put on the SMC website. Last year won best act and best script. This year, submitted three plays, got six submissions. Need ushers. Battle of bands fell to waist side, going to ask those who can to participate in UofT band. They were runner up last year. Laura Fallico raised a question to the rest of the council. Tickets sales were hiked up this year, she would like to take the extra \$2 and \$3 to arts and theatre. Motion forward to allocate from \$2 from student sales and \$3 from adult sales to arts and theatre. Motion carries. Been on commission for two years, think there is great future for theatre at SMC. Community outreach is amazing, so thinks money should be reallocated. Theatre budget were big, summer and fall budget were similar in size. Into the woods. Mike alvaro clarified this because he was on the council then.

Athletics:

Anthony salandra said the council held four very successful events; the Soccer, boozier brown, ball hockey and leg wax. Ball hockey was successful, although forced to move location, had problems with net, the event was very successful. \$1000 was raised from leg wax. \$300 put to New Jerseys. Kyle Farren said the team has won more champions than last year. Women flight football, basketball, men contact hockey lost. There were four intramurals championship. Physed and engineers only had three. He hopes to have Yoga classes. There will be a March Hoser cup tournament, Feb Hart House, second soccer tournament. Varsity has a skating trip to Nathan Philips square. He is looking to hold a few events at Charbonnel lounge. Chartwells is good at specials events like this. Kyle Farren on Yoga classes: Yoga instructors will get get paid. Once a week for three months. Once every three weeks.

UTSU:

Sami Enami said that Adam Awad said most of what's going on. She sent out remarks regarding blackface. Members of UTSU board convinced TTC to extend high school metropass. This will come into effect 2010. Executives went to CFS meeting. For university to defederate, there is an increase to 20%, minimized to two schools at a time. Long term funding for clubs have passed. Clubs can still ask for short term funding. If clubs need more funding, they can apply, funding will be equal to two events.

New initiatives:

Constitutional reform is read.

Article III.2.1.b Currently state:

Currently it says: Twenty council members. Of those twenty councillors, 15 shall stand for election by the student union in the spring election and five shall stand for election in the fall election; at least one councilor elected in the fall election will be a first year student.

It will be amended to say:

Twenty four council members: of these twenty four councillors, 19 shall stand in spring election and five shall stand for election in the fall.

Introduction of Article VI.5.9

On-Campus Commission

a) This Commission shall be directly responsible for insuring the maximum participation and representation of resident students, and that the Council is made aware of the particular concerns of the resident students.

b) Commission will work as a liaison between SMRC and the council

It will be added to VI.5.10

Equity Commission

a) This commission will pertain to matters and issues relating to gender, religion, race, matters pertaining to self identity as well as environmental issues with respect to the University of St. Michael's College.

Introduction of Article VI.7

The Role of the Fall Councillors

The duties of Councillors will now pertain directly to the Commission that each councillor is elected into, during internal election, which will be the first Council meeting following the fall election.

Article III.5.2 currently states:

All Council members shall attend all Council meetings. Any Council member absent during two consecutive meetings shall be deemed to have resigned; reinstatement shall be subject to the approval of the Council. Reinstatement shall occur at the subsequent full Council meeting providing that the Council member in question is present and can explain their absences.

It will be amended to state:

All Council members shall attend all Council meetings. Any Council member absent during three meetings or two consecutive meetings shall be deemed to have resigned; reinstatement shall be subject to the approval of the Council. Reinstatement shall occur at the subsequent full Council meeting providing that the Council member in question is present and can explain their absences.

Article III.5.2. currently states:

All Councillors shall maintain minimum of two office hours per week, save the Representative(s) of the University of Toronto Student Union who is required to serve only one office hour per week. All council members who have consecutively missed three requisite office hours are deemed to have resigned and are subject to a vote of reinstatement.

It will be amended to state:

All Councillors shall maintain minimum of two office hours per week, save the Representative(s) of the University of Toronto Student Union who is required to serve only one office hour per week. All council members who have missed two office hours in one month, are deemed to have resigned and are subject to a vote of reinstatement.

Proposed changes to constitutional reform passed by two thirds of entire council.

Michael Alvaro reminded the council that they can't change wording or meaning of the original proposal. Justin Rodrigues said that this wasn't taken as seriously as it should have been. Stefan said have option to discuss with CRB. Kyle Farren was not sure if all council members are comfortable with this. Need to take this home, do this during break, and maybe have another meeting. Proposed to give it two months, bring up in January, and vote on everything in February. Make foundations for constitution without even CRB seeing. Michael Alvaro reminded that there is a two month

grace period before formal debate. Justin Rodrigues said there will be amendments, and adjustments made accordingly. There will be a process. Kyle Farren was under presumption that the proposal will be put forward in the current condition. Michael Alvaro said if the council intent in altering the original document drastically, then it would be up to discretion of the speaker to determine.

Constitution review board. Fran Turco asked if changing commissioner and officer into one position would be considered a drastic change. Deryn Robson said combining the two positions into one would defeat the purpose of adding the new position, because it is used to add more people to council.

15 minutes allocated to talk on defederating. Amanda Fiume in favour. Motion carries.

James Finlay on defederating: Issue of defederation was not just about black face, voting booths, Jessica Walsh. It involves much bigger implications. Not weight issues when it comes down to defederating. These are just byproducts. Essentially we boil down to what UTSU is doing for SMC. Adam Awad sat in, and we pay him 25 grand and SMC pay 4 grand to do. Sami Enami and Jessica Walsh could have easily communicated. Usually typically only politically involved people, such as those who read the varsity. 300 grand paid to UTSU. This year 310 grand. More students paid this year, just two year, we've paid just over half million, how are we feeling that. We should be asking this to ourselves. Paint financial picture. Boil down to SMCSU. Where is the money going to? In order to get venue close to home, had to increase cover for events. Bear in mind. Just 10 from every student 45 grand. Woodsworth commons is an UTSU initiative. UTSU takes political stances contradictive to SMC. SMC is not included. Mikael Alvato wanted a SMC booth, UTSU didn't want to give SMC a voice. They knew things would change. Reform to strengthen community. Governing council. Town hall. SMC students were able to vote.

Referenda was actually held, SMC students were able to vote.

Not based by percentage of student body. Woodsworth commons campaign itself wasn't well publicised. People most favoured were people from Woodsworth. Steps to defederation. Why are they possible and why not. Commitment neglected, accountability. For the last 5-6 years, people on council has not bothered with their money. UTSU collects \$60-70 dollars from each student. We should educate ourselves, and then we could educate people. If people knew about majority of half of facts presented here, they would be a lot more annoyed than we are today. This is not something people have done good thing on. Health and dental if we defederate. Amanda Fiume said things like these, UTSU executive should be invited to be able to speak regarding this issue. Physically these may be the things we cannot be doing with a smaller pool of people, with less money. What would be steps from there on? Townhall shouldn't be just about cons, should be planning, where to start. Governing council. Legal representation is not SMCSU or college, it is UTSU. UTSU is going to say that. They act on our behalf. We would need to have lot more position, logistics.

Motion to extend ten more minutes by Francesca Imbrogno. Mark seconded. SMC does have their own lawyers.

Cynthia Muthardy wanted to know what would SMC students be cut out of. She wanted to know both sides of the situation.

Adriano Marchese working on all pros and cons and viability of SMC defederating. Will look at all pros and cons so it will touch on legal and financial gains, alternatives. Report will get everyone's attention on matter.

Anthony Salandra wanted to put forward commission who would help with man power, with

what UTSU used to do. So they could talk to some people. In a sense what UTSU did for this council.

Laura Fallico said detailed report show this year UTSU charged \$15 more to support new groups that we do not know about. Standing up on townhall. Representing SMCSU. It's like imposing on our council to speak on behalf. Thinks taking on 300 thousand dollars we would not be prepared to take on. Not all at once. She sees so many pros coming from UTSU. She foresees drastic changes on council and can't internally elect who will be paid 20000 a year.

Justin Rodrigues said the fact that we are so knowledgeable shows that we care. He asked if it is even possible. He does not want to start something SMCSU can't finish. He wants to know if it is even possible from SMCSU.

Fran Turco said Townhall should be neutral standpoint and not just SMC students getting all heated up. Dylan Duvall said people have right to speak, right to speech. At best, union to prevent totalitarianism. You can't say SMC would be only people to go off on this. At secret president meeting, talk to them regarding matter. Talk with other president college and see if it is legitimate. Might be able to modify and change parameters in their constitution, but not defederate.

Kavinda Senanyake thinks the mediator at the Townhall should not be SMC. The mediator should be an outside party. Deryn Robson said defederation did happen at this university when UTSU was called SAC. He suggested for people to come forward and present facts and protests against UTSU in the past. Gabe Deroch, Mike Mayor would be possible speakers. At the end of town hall, would not be saying because of these above presented facts, we will defederate. Possible to impeach president of UTSU. Only 2000 votes are necessary. Simply to bring out facts of things that have happened in the last two years. ENSOC actually have defederation committee. Trinity passed motion. Earning \$25000 a year, UTSU executives are paid more than any student exec in this country, except Carleton. We can't make judgement whether or not we can defederate. Begs a question, how was this done before? It will not a defed ton hall meeting. Just used to bring forth facts.

James Finlay said interest is to paint prper image, and to get right info out there. He will have knowledgeable people speaking on this issue to help everyone understand. He requested legal documents, sat down with all other members, analyzing legal framework. On his personal feelings: Ran on this very issue. 600 grand, half million, and won. Wanted to find out what's going on. Want to be approached or Joseph Uranowski to talk about this. He wants to try best to clear minds and get best out of it.

Francesca Imbrogno thinks the problem with defederation is whether if we want to separate from institution or its people. Michael Alvaro suggests to forward motion to hold town hall.

Justin Rodrigues proposed that instead of postponing the townhall, to level out on issue and settle issue, continue another time or do what mike said.

Francesca Imbrogno motioned to hold townhall to address any issue. AGM. James says this is not good. General town hall. Discussion. Justin Rodrigues thinks that AGM is a different dynamic. Fully understand.

James Finlay said he has been pushing for AGM for a while. However this is not the right time to bring it up. He thinks this distracts internal housekeeping with external. AGM is really council innercentric. Detrimental to confuse the two. Townhall is intended to educate on broad scope of issues. Defederate will not be the centerfold of event.

Kyle sFarren ays to take politically neutral stance. Keep in mind the college's relationship with university.

Cynthia Mutheardy thinks SMCSU needs to be very careful with how name is worded. A general name but not too general name would be appropriate, such as Manifestation of Blackface. People will pick apart whatever you call it. She remains in favour of townhall, as long as it is advertised correctly.

Kavinda Senanyake is happy. He agrees with James Finlay and Cynthia Mutheardy.

Deryn Robson said it will not be a defederation townhall. Talked with Khalid. There will be two main themes. The pros and cons of institution of UTSU, and how current UTSU executives has handled policy, protest.

Purpose of AGM for every council commission to give report. AGM would be about what's going on inside council as opposed to what's going on outside.

Laura Fallico feels like this should be a separate meeting. No singular council can do it alone,

engineers has committee to do it alone. Trinity said they will defederate if they have other college support. UC discussion will be coming up. Scarborough campus doing that. UTM defederated, but they still work with UTSU. UTSU was SAC many years ago, and college have withdrew multiple times. James Finlay requested to see legal framework from the past. Council discuss, constituency informed, if enough. Submits committee, hold referendum, if that passes, then they peace out.

Ghada Al asked the point of townhall. Mike stopped her because it is just reiterating what Deryn Robson has brought up multiple times. Deryn Robson has explained the theme of townhall.

Deryn Robson reminds Ghada Al the motion.

Francesca Imbrogno motioned to amend AGM. SMC relationship beyond the college. She feels like majority of council wants to have meeting. Michael Alvaro said it was never an AGM. Title of townhall yet to be determined. Amendment of SMC based it its relationship with rest of college. Fran Turco second. Deryn Robson discussion.

Stefan Slovak asked if SMCSU's name will be attached to this.

Vote to call to question. Voting on to hold townhall. Topic of townhall will be SMC relationship beyond the college. Dylan Duvall, Justin Rodrigues, Stefan Slovak and Kavinda Senanyake abstained.

Cynthia Mutheardy shout out to Angela Accardo for her great job in keeping Loretto informed. Michael said it is not shout out time yet.

Other business

Mark Hyer, Laura Fallico, and Ashleigh Schollig did a cleanup of office. Stress general/ basic cleanliness.

Laura Fallico said to remove personal items, otherwise will be rid of before January. Amir Torabi started on Friday to clean.

Justin Rodrigues said be careful what you put in fridge. Half drink pop cans, only 375mL. Fridge was a mess.

Laura Fallico said items behind desk should be moved because they don't belong in the office. Alumni booked for 13th. Maybe push week or two later. Flexibility. Motion to move date until and meeting has been held by Cynthia Mutheardy. Second by Fran Turco. Motion carried called to question.

James Finaly on video for winterfest. He will make sure SMCSU will be in it. He mentioned that West Side Story cast will have guest appearance.

Kavinda Senanyake said office internet was slow. No internet coming from either of port. Few year ago, college cut internet.
